

Goals for Farm Bill 2.0

The One Big Beautiful Bill delivered the most significant investment in America's producers in decades and enacted the boldest reforms to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program in its history. But the job isn't finished. Our farmers and ranchers still face challenges that demand action.

Title I: Commodities

 Strengthen the commodity programs passed in Reconciliation including creating a standing block grant authority for appropriated disaster funds, making propane eligible for the Farm Storage Facility Loan Program, and making Dairy Forward Pricing permanent.

Title II: Conservation

- Include precision agriculture for cost-share for Environmental Quality Incentives Program ()
 and Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP); and authorize a state soil health program
 within CSP.
- Set time limits for approvals and payments for the **Regional Conservation Partnership Program** (RCPP).
- Reauthorize the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP).
- Improve administration and modernize P.L. 566 (Small Watershed Program)

Title III: Trade

- Direct USDA to use **common food names** to secure foreign markets for goods.
- Require a **Specialty Crop Report** to increase American competitiveness.

Title IV: Nutrition

- Correcting draconian, outdated policy and allowing individuals with past drug offenses to receive SNAP.
- Exclude specific SNAP Employment and Training earnings when determining eligibility for SNAP.
- Ensure the **income of young people** is excluded from a household's eligibility for SNAP.

Title V: Credit

- **Reauthorize all programs** that expired in the 2018 Farm Bill to ensure access to credit for producers.
- Increase **loan limits** to match the capital-intensive cost of production for producers.
- Ensure that lenders have all the tools in the toolbox to assist producers.

Title VI: Rural Development

- Reauthorize broadband programs.
- Improve **precision agriculture** practices and increase accessibility.
- Codify and improve the Rural Hospital Technical Assistance Program.
- Reauthorize and strengthen the Rural Innovation Stronger Economy (RISE) Grant Program.
- Strengthen essential rural services by codifying and reauthorizing multiple water and waste programs, business and industry programs, and rural development programs.

Title VII: Research, Extension, and Related Matters

Reauthorize funding for research and extension programs.

Title VIII: Forestry

- Create new and build upon existing authorities for the Forest Service to expand active management.
- Support the President's executive order by increasing timber harvests through **extended contracts**.

Title IX: Energy

- Allow for critical cost and energy savings by increasing access to the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP).
- Streamline program delivery and enhance program integrity for **biobased market programs** and **biofuels and bioproducts development programs**.
- Maintain the authority for the **Higher Blends Infrastructure Incentive Program**.
- Require the USDA to study the impacts of solar installations on prime, unique, or statewide or locally important farmland.

Title X: Horticulture

 Create common sense regulatory reforms that prioritize science and transparency in agriculture.

Title XI: Crop Insurance

- **Expand crop insurance** for specialty crop producers.
- Encourage RMA to create new and **improve existing crop insurance policies** for additional crops or unique risks.

Title XII: Miscellaneous

- Address Prop 12 and A-PLUS
- Address provisions related to animal health and management
